Part I: Introduction



Introducing Hojatoleslam Heidari Abhari

As Hojatoleslam Mohammad Reza Heidari Abhari has attended the classes of great masters of the seminary for many years, and, for ten years he has responded to children's religious questions, and served for three years in the office of Islamic Development Organization, and had answered the question of students in written form and had extensive studies in religious issues, and according to his literary interests and his developmental experiences in schools and universities and his continuous communication with children and adolescents, as well as his pursuit of religious works of Christianity, as well as attending some international exhibitions abroad, his productions have special features that are discussed here:

- Scientific mastery and application of authentic religious resources

The works of Master Heidari Abhari are the result of continuous friendship with books and the tradition, and hence his great efforts to make his books textually credible. He has never stopped his studies of the works of the great masters of religion and the discussion of Sahifeh Sajjadiyeh (a book of supplication attributed to the Fourth Imam of Shia) and the Holy Quran and attending the seminary and university discussions. To Heidari Abhari, a religious writer should never distance from the Quran and tradition as two main sources of light and wisdom. Unfortunately, sometimes it happens that some religious works are devoid of the necessary scientific mastery. Close familiarity with the old and new sources of the Quran and tradition and continuous communication with various areas of religious sciences, as well as building on consultations with creative young scholars, and also the use of other advisers who upgrade the works through criticisms, makes the texts and works of Master Heidari important and powerful.

The scientific rigor of the works by the scientific works of Hojatoleslam Heidari makes the religious publication industry welcome his productions.

If a good religion has four dimensions including a strong theme, pure idea, attractive literature, and appropriate with time, the works of Heidari Abhari have provided the first dimension.

- Invention and Innovation

Repetition is one of the biggest problems of religious works. This is the cause of some lack of attention by children and adolescents and their final deprivation of this body of wisdom. Many works by Master Heidari Abhari, either in terms of form or in terms of the subject are innovative. He never starts writing before discovering a new theme or a new form. To find new themes and forms, he continuously talks to children and teenagers, to parents and teachers, to publishers and writers, and other agents of culture.

Of course, the biggest source of inspiration for the production of new works is the wise, mythical, and artistic words of the Ahlolbait, the Family of the Prophet (PBUT). For example, Heidari wrote his book, *Out of This House to That House*, as inspired by the Speech of the Prophet Muhammad (PBUH), and his other book, *Accidental* as inspired by the words of Imam Sadiq (PBUH), and *The Birth of Chicks* is inspired by the debates on a Shiite leader.

He believes that for a writer to reach new and attractive ideas, he should be deeply associated with religious teachings.

Considering the requirements of the day

At any point in history, people are struggling with specific issues and problems, and every time has its special and different conditions, so the writers to create new works, should understand the requirements of their time and the needs of their audience.

Hojatoleslam Heidari Abhari, under the influence of the martyred Allameh Morteza Motahari, whose books were all in response to the contemporary conditions, has a keen eye for the needs of the day. For example, after attending the Quran's exhibition and being faced with a mass of children's questions about God, wrote *Quranic Theology for Children*, and raising the idea of lifestyle, he wrote his *Encyclopedia of Lifestyle* and during the period of economic hardship and the need of children for economic literacy with an Islamic outlook, he wrote the book *Money*, *God*, *Children*.

He considers audience requirements assessment as an integral part of the process of writing. Hence, he devotes a considerable amount of his time to understand the needs of the audience. His continuous presence in schools and talks with students and organizing question and answer meetings is part of his activities to understand and recognize the needs of the audience. Undoubtedly, for writers who do not recognize the requirements of the day and do not search in the social field, it is too difficult to create convenient works. Some of the works of Heidari Abhari have received a warm welcome from the people, a fact that suggests the importance of requirement assessment for the success of a writer.

- Linking religious education with contemporary life

Religion is a truth that has guided humanity for ages and centuries, it is a sun that will never set and will continue to guide humanity in any historical situation. Although our dear Islam, dawned in one thousand and four hundred years ago in the Arab region, its message is global and eternal. Those who propagate religion should be very careful in expressing the teachings of the religion of Islam and not provide an old, static and unpleasant image of the glorious messages of religion. As Islam, at the beginning of its birth, introduced Salman Farsi, Bilal ibn Rabah, the Roman Sohaib, and Abuzar and Meghdad of Hejaz to high values of mysticism and faith, and after that has created opportunities for the spiritual growth of all the people.

Unfortunately, some religious works do not benefit from attractive and fascinating literature and appropriate images and graphics, and therefore after studying such books, the audiences would feel that the message of the religion has nothing to do with their lives.

Hojatoleslam Heidari Abhari is very careful in his selection of subjects, his prose, and illustrations to make his works communicate the messages with children. For example, in *Seventy SMSs from the Prophet* the children read the prophet's hadiths in seventy SMSs, and in the book, *Mohammad (PBUH) was Like a Flower*, the image of the Prophet is portrayed in contemporary urban settings, and in *Money, God, Children* the readers are invited to contemplate on contemporary economic issues through religious concepts.

- Maximum concern for the international audience, especially Muslims

From one point of view, Heidari's works can be divided into three categories:

1. The works are useful for all monotheists. (inter-religious works)

2.Works that all Muslims can use.

3.Works that are more read in Iran.

Since the topics that Heidari selects are not limited to the Iranian audiences, he has chosen his audience to all the monotheists and followers of Abrahamic religions and at least all Muslims. Hence, in his content production practices, he considers international concerns. Translation of his works to other languages can show his deep knowledge of international settings and the requirements for working in these fields.

Deep harmony between text and graphics

Illustrations and graphical representations are very important elements in books for children and adolescents for both attracting the audience and conveying the messages. Therefore, the graphic artist should fully understand the aims and objectives of the writer to make the work attractive. According to Heidari Abhari, the writer should be in close communication with the illustrator and inform them of the educational incentive and goals of the work. Hence, the write is present at every stage of producing books and moves in line with the artistic elements of the book. Of course, this is far from interfering with the professional work of those cherished artists or limiting their field of action. The result of this empathy and consensus can be seen in many of the writer's works. It should be noted that his twenty-five-year experience in the production of religious works and his dialogue with high-profile writers and graphics, has provided rich experiences even in the field of illustrations and graphics.


Autobiography



I was born on the first day of 1348 the Persian year, equal to 21st March 1969 to an Abhari father and a Zanjani mother, both small cities in the northwestern region of Iran. Our house was close to Takhti street, in a neighborhood attributed to Takhti, the famous wrestler who won the Olympic medal and is famous for his moral behavior and devotion to help the poor. I was the fourth child of the family, naturally with more activities than the elder ones. My father was a worker but with strong interests in our education.

I passed the elementary and early secondary education in "Hojjatieh Liberty Message" " and "Islamic Jafari" Schools. The Islamic Jafari School was dependent on the "Society for Islamic Education", with a strong focus on religious education.

I was nine years old when the Islamic Revolution overthrew the Shah regime and in the blessing of the revolution, the activities of the mosques came to fruition. I also worked in the Hojatieh mosque,



which was run by the father of Shahid Haqqani (from the martyrs of early days of revolution), where the activities continued until 1987 when I migrated to the city of Qom for study. That period of my life had a lot of influence on my career and made me ready for further seminary and religious education.

I passed my high school years in Marvi High School in Naser Khosrow Street. My high school education was interrupted by my departure to battlefields. In 1985 I left the school for military training at Imam Hussein military base and then I departed to the battlefield to participate in the holy defense.

By 1988, the final year of the war, I attended the frontline several times and I was injured on several occasions between 1986 and 1988. When the UN Resolution was adopted and the war ended, I was in Shafa Yahyan Hospital for my last injuries. The war also had a significant impact on me.

In 1986 I was accepted into the Qom Seminary, but I did not attend the school, because of the necessities of the field of war. 1987 is the first year of my attendance at seminary school. Of course, even in those days, the school never deprived me of my right to attend the battlefield. My formal education at the seminary took almost twenty years.

Among the most prominent masters whose classes I have attended, I can mention Grand Ayatollah Javadi Amoli. I attended his interpretation classes for three years and his Islamic Law classes, for one year. From the very first year of scholarship, despite the necessary prerequisites, I participated in the interpretation classes of Grand Ayatollah Javadi Amoli. His interpretation classes were held an hour before noon Azan, next to the Grand Mosque of the Holy Shrine. I was fascinated by these classes. Although I could not understand much of the master's terminology, in general, their lesson was useful for me and I had a great pleasure attending those classes. The other great master whose classes were so useful for me was the Grand Ayatollah Shobeiri Zanjani. I participated in his highest level of discussions (known as Kharej, i.e. beyond books, after long years of formal studies) for thirteen years and also for five years in his free discussions held in his home. Grand Ayatollah Shobeiri was not only my teacher of jurisprudence, but he also taught me scientific accuracy, freedom of thought, the righteousness of action, as well as scientific moderation and fairness.

Simultaneous with participation in seminary educational settings, I had many promotional experiences. Over and over again I attended universities where I discussed religious issues with young and talented people. But my most important promotional experience is related to the Quran Exhibition, an experience that was repeated ten times in ten years. Since 2007, I have attended every Ramadan and responded to children's religious questions. These talks made me more familiar with the minds and language of the children and I came to a better understanding of their religious needs that was an introduction to my writings. For example, my *Quranic Theology for Children* is the result of my discussions at the exhibition with the subject of theology. I had my interest in writing even before entering the seminary. However, I published my first book in 1995 and had prepared and published more than 150 titles to this day for the children.
